Shrine Exhibit Opens By Bill Kreuger

The Grand Lodge of Iowa has always had a close relationship with the Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. In 1891, the El Kahir Shrine donated a beautiful exhibit case to the museum's collection, then called the "Archaeological Department of the Library." This was especially donated by then Illustrious Potentate Brother C.W. Eaton in order to display a collection of Shrine related artifacts and materials that had been donated to the museum by Samuel W. Briggs of Cleveland, Ohio in 1890. Brother Briggs was the Imperial Potentate of the Shrine at the time of his donation.



We now fast forward 126 years and the El Kahir Shrine

donated collections related to two (2) Imperial Potentates from Cedar Rapids, Iowa in early June 2017. They were Edwin Alderman (1908-1909) and Dr. Russell Anthony, DVM (1986-1987).

On Friday October 13, we opened a new Shrine exhibit featuring many of the artifacts detailing the history of Dr. Anthony. The exhibit was opened to a full house of both Shriners and Masons from the local area. An older exhibit case that had been used to exhibit some of the mementos at the Shrine headquarters in Hiawatha was cleaned and prepared for the exhibit opening.

Included with the attendees were Dr. Anthony's widow Shirley and his son Ross. A brief ceremony was held with comments made by the current El Kahir Potentate Illustrious Sir David A. Robinson and Grand Secretary Craig Davis. An unveiling of the case officially opened the exhibit to attendees. Other exhibit galleries were opened so that visitors could enjoy all of the museums in the Grand Lodge building.

Meanwhile, what of the original Shrine case that had been donated 126 years ago? The case had been in use in the original library building up until that building was razed in the early 1950s. It had been in storage for many years in the basement of the current Grand Lodge building, probably since the early 1950s. Now, it has been almost completely restored and was reassembled a few years ago through the efforts of PGM Denny Zahrt, Paul and Steve Nielsen. It is now located in the Hall of Masonry. It still holds many of the original Shrine related materials that were donated by Past Imperial Potentate Briggs along with Shrine related objects that have been donated within the last few years.

The recently opened Shrine exhibit is located in the front hall of the Grand Lodge building. We cordially invite you to visit the Iowa Masonic Library and Museums to see this exhibit. While you are here, you can check out the original Shrine case as well the other exhibits, which include "Celebrating 300 Years of Freemasonry, 1717-2017: Masonic Treasures of the Grand Lodge of Iowa." This temporary exhibit will be open until December 29, 2017.

Brother Norm Stewart Basketball Hall of Famer



Brother Norman E. Stewart was raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason on October 14, 1964. He was born in Shelby County Missouri. He grew up in the small farming community of Shelbyville and graduated from high school in 1952. After high school he attended the University of Missouri where he was a standout in both basketball and baseball. In 1956 he became a Helms Foundation All-American Basketball player and was drafted by the St. Louis Hawks. He also signed a contract with the Baltimore Orioles, but never played at the big-league level.

He began his head coaching career at State College of Iowa (University of Northern Iowa) in 1961-1962 season. During his career at Northern Iowa he had a 97 – 42 record and won two conference championships. In March of 1967 Stewart was named head coach at the University of Missouri. In 32 years of coaching at Missouri, Stewart had a record of 634 – 333 and won 8 Big Eight Conference regular season championships, 6 Big Eight Tournament titles, 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, 5 NIT appearances and 1 CCA post season tournament. He was named UPI Coach of the Year in 1982 and Associated Press Coach of the Year in 1994. Coach Stewart was inducted into the Missouri University Athletics Hall of Fame in 1990, in 2014 he was inducted into the St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame, and in 2007 he was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. Brother Stewart is a member of Black Hawk Lodge No. 65 in Cedar Falls.


