Grand Master's Message "Be A Mason"



Sharing Masonry for some is as natural as the proverbial falling off a log. Others find it challenging to share something so valuable and deeply personal that we just have a hard time explaining it to others. No matter where on the spectrum you find yourself it might be good to review some of the reasons men join Masonry and what Masons tell men about Masonry. I would encourage you to consider this article as a starting point and add to it. I asked the person that had helped a lot of the active members of our lodge become Masons. What do you say to people you talk to about joining Masonry? His answer was not what I expected.

I expected him to say that he talked about the fellowship among the members of our lodge. Fellowship is the first reason that comes to mind for many of us to be a Mason. That comradery that is felt among brothers for many is the one thing that should never change about Masonry. Most lodges do a good

job of providing fellowship for their active members.

If it wasn't fellowship, the other thing I expected that he talked about was educating a man to become a better man. When this is brought up usually there is another question. How do you do that? There are multiple answers to this question. First and foremost, by learning and practicing the lessons taught in our ritual. It is a 24/7 task to work towards being a Master Mason. Next, by the association with other good men. It is very valuable to be able to share and learn from their experiences.

So, what was it he tells a prospective Mason? He tells them we do a lot of good things in the community. Then he starts to list the things our lodge does like the fund raisers we do for our local food bank and historical society. The support we have given to various individuals with help from the Grand Charity Fund. He is going to add the bikes for books program our lodge is starting.

What can we take from this? For many of us we have found something in Masonry that we weren't looking for when we became Masons. Whether you share the reasons to be a Mason, what others found in Masonry, or something completely unique to your own experience. The important thing is to share Masonry with those that would make a good Mason.

2019 Iowa Masonic Scholarships

Pictures of the seventy recipients of a 2019 Grand Lodge of Iowa \$2,000 Scholarship and \$1,000 Scholarships are shown throughout this issue of the "Bulletin." All guotes are taken from the recommendations of high school staff members that accompanied the student's applications.

Brother John C. Rothlisberger chairs the Scholarship Selection Committee that sorted through over 650 completed applications, and selected 70 applicants for interviews. From those interviewed sixty outstanding students were chosen to receive \$2,000 scholarships, and the other ten received \$1,000 scholarships. The interviews were held at the Iowa Masonic Library in Cedar Rapids, Acanthus Lodge in Des Moines, Exodus Lodge in Exira, and Tyrrell Lodge in Waverly. The students and their parents learned about Masonry and its support of public education, including the scholarship program at each location. Since the program began in 1970, 2,435 scholarships totaling \$3,520,900 have been awarded.

The Grand Lodge of Iowa, 1844-2019: 175 Years of Masonic Light

Mark the week of June 10, 2019 down as that is when we plan to open our new exhibit on the 175th anniversary of the Grand Lodge of Iowa. There is a lot of history to cover in a relatively small space. It is a challenging prospect but the exhibit is coming along. The exhibit will be broken down into smaller pieces that cover the wide range of years involved.

The initial portion of the exhibit covers the birth of the Grand Lodge of Iowa and the formation of the earliest lodges in the Territory and State. It also covers our first Grand Secretary, Theodore S. Parvin and our earliest Grand Masters. We will have a section devoted to the Masonic ritual and its development in Iowa. We examine the part played by Robert F. Bower in the development of the collection of the Iowa Masonic Library. Bower was something of a mentor to Parvin and it was Bower's Masonic collection that was acquired after his death that helped the Iowa Masonic Library become one of the largest in the world.

The middle portion of the exhibit examines Newton Parvin and the growth of Masonry after the end of World War I. This was an exciting time as there was the National Masonic Research Society, the first ever meeting of Grand Masters and then the organization of the Masonic Service Association. Newton Parvin worked to make the Library more accessible to Masons in Iowa by creating a program entitled "Traveling Libraries." We have some of the old boxes that were used to ship the "libraries" to some of the various lodges in the state for their temporary use.

We will examine C.C. Hunt and his time as Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Iowa. Hunt was a prolific writer and student of Masonry. Among his writings are Some Thoughts on Masonic Symbolism, History of the Cryptic Rite, and Some Lessons on Capitular Masonry. These materials are still used by Masonic scholars today.

We will then move into the "modern" period with an examination of the construction of the current Grand Lodge building and its contents. This will include an often overlooked individual, Francis Robert White. He is the artist that created the beautiful stained glass windows that are such an important part of our current building.

Along the way, we will visit the Cerneau period in Iowa during the latter part of the 19th century, the Prince Hall Grand Lodge and the recognition of Prince Hall in Iowa. We will also visit with important writers in Iowa Masonry, Joseph Fort Newton and Harry Haywood. We will examine the expulsion of two Past Grand Masters, James Hartsock and George Schoonover.

The exhibit will end with an overview of "famous" lowa Masons and with a collection of Grand Masters pins. I hope you will try to visit the Grand Lodge during this important year. The exhibit will close on December 31, 2019.
